

God's Redemptive Plan Through the Ages

Direction: Read the timeline from **left to right** — **eternity to eternity.**

The top bar shows God's focus: first on the **Nations (Gen 1–11)**, then on **Israel**, and finally on the **Church (1995 +)**, which continues until the **Rapture**.

1. The Beginnings — Genesis 1–11

- Creation God creates a perfect world.
- Fall, Flood, Babel Humanity's repeated failure leads to judgment and dispersion.
- God narrows His plan from all nations to one man **Abraham**.

2. The Patriarchs — Genesis 12-50

- Four circles: Abraham → Isaac → Jacob → Joseph.
- God's covenant promises land, nation, and blessing for all peoples through Abraham's seed.

3. The Exodus — Exodus-Deuteronomy

Box stepping off the line: Moses leads Israel out of Egypt — birth of a nation redeemed by God.

4. The Conquest — Joshua

 Box returning to timeline: Joshua leads Israel into the Promised Land — partial fulfillment of God's promise.

5. The Judges — Judges-Ruth

- Spiral symbol: cycles of sin → oppression → repentance → deliverance.
- "Everyone did what was right in his own eyes."

6. The United Kingdom — 1 Samuel-1 Kings 11

- Box labeled S D S Saul, David, Solomon.
- Israel's golden age of unity and worship in Jerusalem.

7. The Divided Kingdom — 1 Kings 12–2 Kings 25

- Split boxes:
 - o Israel (North, Jeroboam) captured by Assyria (722 BC).
 - o Judah (South, Rehoboam) later taken by Babylon (586 BC).

8. Captivity & Restoration — Ezra-Nehemiah

- Arrow returning: Judah's return after 70 years led by Zerubbabel, Ezra, Nehemiah.
- Temple and walls rebuilt, but hearts still awaited full renewal.

9. The Silent Years — 400 BC to Christ

 No prophet's voice; world empires rise — Persian, Greek, Hasmonean, Roman — setting the stage for the Messiah.

10. The Church Age — Acts-Revelation 3

- 1995 + the Church continues from Pentecost until the Rapture.
- God now calls out a people for His name from every nation.

11. The Future — Revelation 4–22

 Rapture, Tribulation, Return of Christ, Kingdom, and New Creation — completing God's plan from eternity to eternity.

Key Theme:

God's plan never fails.

From creation to new creation, His purpose moves steadily forward — through Israel and the Church — until His glory fills the earth. (Hab 2:14)
